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## **F1 Racing Returns to Fuji Speedway**

Between 28-30 September 2007 F1 Racing returns to Toyota's Fuji Speedway for the first time in almost 30 years. Located at the foot of the majestic Mt. Fuji, the circuit makes a stunning backdrop to the world-class show. Established four decades ago Fuji Speedway has seen the likes of Niki Lauda and Gilles Villeneuve negotiating speed and chicanes in the quest for world championships. Following a major re-profiling of the track the circuit re-opened in 2005, and won the bid to become the new host of the Formula One Grand Prix in Japan.
